MURDOCH MACKENZIE FONDS. – 1900-1936. – 12 cm of textual records. – 2 microfilm reels : positive and negative.

Murdoch MacKenzie (1858-1938) was a Presbyterian/United Church missionary to China. He was born in Scotland and studied for the ministry at McGill University and Presbyterian College, Montreal. In 1889, he went as a missionary to Honan, China, and worked there almost continuously until 1936. He acted as a leader in the National Council of China and the movement for a union of churches in China. He was elected Moderator of the Presbyterian Church in Canada while on furlough in 1913.

Fonds consists of address, sermons, correspondence, publications re Honan mission, material re Moderator's Office, and diaries (on microfilm), 1902-1936.
