Note

Otho Christopher (O.C.) Elliott was a teacher at Kingston Collegiate Vocational Institute and avid researcher of the Beardsmore Relic hoax.

Elliott was born in 1898 in Peterborough, Ontario. His family lived in Belleville and St. Thomas before settling in Toronto. Elliott studied theology at McMaster University and trained at the Ontario College of Education. Between 1918 and 1919 Elliott served in the Canadian Overseas Expeditionary Force and the Canadian Siberian Expeditionary Force. Elliott's first teaching position Fort Arthur High School. In 1928 he married Cathrine (Kate) Jarvis, a nurse. They had one daughter, Susan, born in 1942. Between 1936-1941 Elliott worked as the director of the commercial department at the Kingston Collegiate and Vocational Institute. In 1941, Elliott began work as a veterans welfare officer at was then called the Department of Pensions and National Health. Elliott worked in Veterans Affairs for the remainder of his career.

Between 1934 and 1941 Elliott researched the authenticity of the Beardsmore relics alongside Dr. T.L. Tanton. Much of their knowledge and research went ignored.

Elliott died on March 3 1958 in Ottawa, Ontario.

Custodial history

The materials were donated Susan (Elliott) MacLatchie and her husband Jim MacLatchie between 1972-1973.

Scope and content

Fonds consists of correspondence, photographs, news clippings, and manuscripts related to the Beardmore Relics which were believed to be Viking in origin.

The Beardmore Relics were supposedly discovered by James Edward Dodd, an amateur prospector who on an expedition southwest of Beardmore, Ontario in May 1931. The relics were purchased by the ROM in 1936 where they stayed on display until 1956-1957 after a public inquiry when Walter Dodd, son of James, claimed that his father found the relics in a basement in Port Arthur and planted them at the site of discovery. The Beardmore relics are authentically Norse and estimated to have been created between 850 and 1025.
