UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA BOARD OF PUBLICATION FONDS. – 1908-1971, PREDOMINANT 1926-1968. – 10 m of textual records and other material.

The Board of Publication was constituted at the General Council of 1926, but this collection contains records that relate to the earliest years of publishing in the Methodist Churches--Methodist Episcopal Church in Canada, 1828-1833, Wesleyan Methodist Church in Canada, Methodist Church of Canada, and Methodist Church (Canada). From 1829 with the publication of the Christian Guardian under Egerton Ryerson, the Wesleyan Methodists were active in religious and educational publishing, and after the midcentury expanded their publishing to include Canadian literature. The Ryerson Press imprint, officially adopted in 1919, was the trade name used until the Press was sold in 1971. The Board of Publication carried on the publishing work of the United Church and was dissolved in 1968 with the establishment of the Division of Communication.

Collection consists of six series: Methodist publishing records, 1836-1926; records of the Board of Publication, 1926-1968; records of the Ryerson Press, 1919-1971; records relating to the buildings, 1808-1960; photographs; personnel files, ca. 1922-1977.

Includes, as well, 572 reels of microfilm (undescribed); 211 photographs; 2881 glass slides; 16 architectural drawings.

<u>SERIES 1: METHODIST/PRESBYTERIAN PUBLISHING RECORDS. – 1839-1926. – 2 m of textual records.</u>

The Book Committee (Book and Publishing Committee after 1913) of the Methodist Churches generally oversaw publishing activities, while the Book Steward served as the day-to-day manager of publishing, marketing, and property concerns. In 1884 the newly established Methodist Church of Canada divided the Book Committee into Eastern and Western Sections, headquartered in Toronto and Halifax respectively, each with a Book Steward. In addition, editors were elected at General Conference for the other publications and Sabbath School materials of the Church. By the 1920s there were three sections of the Book and Publishing Committee, Eastern, Central and Western, although only the first two had Book Stewards. The Western and then the Central Section of the Committee had control of the Toronto printing establishment, the largest publishing asset of the Church. The Book Stewards up to 1926 were the Reverends Egerton Ryerson, James Richardson, Matthew Lang, John Ryerson, Alexander McNab, Anson Green, George R. Sanderson, Samuel Rose, William Briggs and Samuel Fallis.

Series consists of a collection of records relating to the administrative, business and editorial side of publishing. It contains minutes of the Book Committee/Book and Publishing Committee, 1836-1874, and of its Western Section 1875-1926; records of the Book Steward, including correspondence, some personal, of William Briggs, 1879-1918; and business records, including ledgers on production jobs, indexes of printing jobs, 1895-1906, equipment purchase records, agreements with other publishers, cash and stock lists, and sales and annual reports from the Montreal Book Room (1889-1905). In addition, there are legal records relating to bequests and deeds in favour of the Book Room; labour records relating to wages and labour disputes (including files on the 1921 typographical workers strike); agreements with authors regarding publication; and memoirs and reminiscences concerning the early history of the Book Room.

Also included are the Presbyterian Church in Canada Sunday School and Board of Publication minutes, 1898-1926.

Briggs demanded reparation for the losses sustained by the publication of the book. Morgan, however, was penniless, and when he died his state provided nothing. The Board of Publication was established at the 1926 General Council of the United Church, as the body overseeing the publication, sale and distribution of religious and other literature through the United Church Publishing House. The imprint Ryerson Press was used until 1971. As well as The United Church Observer, this included the magazines of the several Boards of the Church and Sunday School publications. The Board's makeup reflected its service function, with other Departments and Boards represented on the Board and its Executive. The Book Steward was responsible to the Board, and acted as the Board's Secretary up to 1963, when that position was abolished. A General Manager was then appointed to manage the publishing operation and a separate Secretary was appointed. The Book Stewards were the Reverends Samuel Fallis, 1918-1933; Donald M. Soldandt, 1933-1936, and C.H. Dickinson, 1937-1963. C.H. Dickinson became Secretary of the Board in 1963 and served until his retirement in 1966. He was succeeded by Dr. A.C. Forrest, as acting Secretary, until the Board was disbanded in 1968.

Series consists of records relating to the work of the Board, including Board minutes, 1940-1967, Executive Committee minutes, 1940-1944, 1953-1967, annual reports, 1932-1965 (incomplete), and agenda materials; correspondence files of the Book Steward/Board Secretary (C.H. Dickinson); United Church Hymnaries, 1928-1930; unpublished letters to the editor of The United Church Observer, 1965-1978; and minutes of the Joint Lesson Committee (with Board of Christian Education) on curriculum planning, 1939-1945; Financial records of the United Church Publishing House, 1961-1967, Advertisement Readership Service for the Observer, 1965-1967, Editorial Readership Service for the Observer, 1965-1967. Also includes 3 photographs of the exterior of Wesley Buildings.

SERIES 3: RECORDS OF RYERSON PRESS. - 1919-1971. - 2 m of textual records.

Founded in 1829 as the Methodist Book and Publishing House (A.Egerton Ryerson was its first editor and Book Steward). The Ryerson Press was established in 1919 as the trade name for the Methodist publications. The Press, under editor Lorne Pierce, continued the work of promoting new Canadian literary talent, while at the same time maintaining the religious and educational publishing of the Church. By the 1960s deficits had accumulated and sale of the Press became an issue. In 1971 Ryerson was purchased by an American firm, and became part of McGraw-Hill-Ryerson.

Series consists of minutes and correspondence of the Management Committee, 1964-1970, and some personal papers of Lorne Pierce. Business records include: notes on printing costs, 1940-1942, sales records, financial statements (1940s), profit and loss accounts, reviews of all operations of the Press by management consultants, 1960s, balance sheets and accounts, 1923-1939, operating and financial statements, 1941-1970, book and back lists, 1919-1935, and 565 reels of microfilmed business records (sales receipts, orders, etc.), 1955-1969. Legal records are included, relating to land holdings and deeds and literary and film agreements. Labour records include employees' benefit plans, labour relations in the 1950s, and payroll statements. Records on the publication of the United Church Hymnary include records of the Committee on Worship and Ritual. Also included is a series of catalogues of Ryerson books and historical documents relating to the founding of the Press.
