Dear Members:

Having been asked to take a column, I shall try to carry on from week to week on liturgical matters. This week we have Ash Wednesday, so called because on that day, blessed ashes are placed upon the heads of the faithful.

The use of ashes as a symbol of humility goes back to the Old Testament dispensation. It was introduced by the Church into her Liturgy at an early date, to illustrate her discipline towards notorious sinners subjected to public penance. On Ash Wednesday, such were formally expelled from the Church by the Bishop, and from that day until Holy Thursday, they remained aloof from the Communion of the faithful assisting at divine worship at the entrance of the church, clad in sackcloth and ashes. It is in remembrance of this discipline that the Church distributes ashes to all the faithful, pronouncing over each one the words: "Remember, O man, that thou art dust, and unto dust thou shalt return."

"RECTITUDE IS A PERPETUAL VICTORY"

THE FAMILY ROSARY

It is the purpose of these few words to try and express the benefits derived from this devotion of the Family Rosary. No doubt you have already observed the stress presently placed upon devotion to the Blessed Virgin. Catholic newspapers and Catholic radio programs are loud in their appeal to the faithful to increase their prayers and supplications to our Blessed Lady. The Lenten season accentuates the need for such devotion; especially the Rosary.

The Rosary was introduced in the 13th century by the Blessed Virgin, when she appeared to St. Dominic, teaching him the prayer, and instructing him to teach it to the world. These were her words telling the secrets of its power: "Introduce the Rosary devotion everywhere, teach it to the people and tell them that this devotion is most pleasing to my Divine Son as well as to me. By means of the Rosary devotion, virtue will flourish, vice will be destroyed, heresy will perish, and divine graces will be obtained. The Rosary will be an inexhaustible fountain of every kind of blessing. I promise you that I will prove by many graces how pleasing this devotion is to me and how profitable to the faithful".

Two centuries later she appeared to Blessed Alan, and to him too, she made certain promises. Here are four of them: "He who calls on me through the Rosary shall not perish. The true children of the Rosary shall enjoy great glory in Heaven. Whatever you ask through the Rosary shall be granted. Those who propagate my Rosary shall be helped by me in all their necessities." Coming closer to our times, we have further evidence of the great value of the Rosary, for our Immaculate Mother appeared to St. Bernadette, and again in 1917, in Fatima, Port. warning the world to pray with their Rosaries in order to be saved from sin.

The present degraded condition of affairs in the world is the strongest argument for the urgency of immediate prayer--the prayers of every man, woman, and child, the prayer of the Family Rosary. For it is the family that is threatened today. It is the family that must be saved if the world is to be saved. It is the Rosary saving the family through the family, thus saving the world.

The Family Rosary is a lesson in living. A father and mother on their knees teach their children dependence upon God.
