Sheldon are still in London  
and won't be over here  
till Spring. Tell them not  
to be in too great a hurry  
to get here because it only  
means that their days of  
longing to get back to  
Canada will be longer.  
I know I was much  
pleased to leave Canada  
but I would be much  
more pleased to be on  
my way back.



I get two letters per week from home so I am kept pretty well posted, and the mails have been very regular lately.

I suppose the boys will all be home for Xmas and you will be having a fine time. I hope they appreciate it because they surely won't spend Xmas with you there. If I am home in two years I shall think I am doing fine. You hear a lot of talk about ending the war

but don't look for an end  
for more than a year yet  
at the least.

Now auntie don't  
let anything I write get  
into the paper because it  
may not be healthy for me.
